





Our own Kevin Laundroche will present his images from the Valley of Fire at the March 13th meeting..

The presentation for the March meeting will focus on one of Kevin Laundroche's favorite venues to shoot, which is the Valley of Fire state park in Nevada. In the past year he has been in the park for eight days of shooting. Most mornings rising at 4:30 am to get sunrise and staying till sunset. In which the narrow canyons provide shaded shooting most of the day in the winter months. One of the best features of Valley of Fire State park is that going from location to location is only a short distance. The one piece of advice in shooting in Valley of Fire is to make sure you have a supply of water and food because there is only a drinking fountain at the visitor center.





Kevin is a native of Michigan, but has been living and working in Kentucky for the past twenty years at General Electric as an Industrial Designer. Kevin graduated from the Center for Creative Studies in Detroit Michigan with a bachelor's of fine arts in industrial design in 1982. Kevin's photographic experience was mostly product related in support of his profession in designing products until the early 2000's when he started shooting digital with Nikon. His camera bag consists of a Nikon D700 and D300 with Nikkor lenses which include a 14-24mm 2.8, 24-70mm 2.8, and a 70-200mm 2.8. Additionally he has a 105mm 2.8, and 50mm 1.4 macro. Most of his landscape photography is shot using either the 14-24mm, or the 24-70mm lens, rarely using anything longer. All of his post processing work is done exclusively in Photoshop, and Adobe Camera Raw.






