Many photographers today, depend on high ISO settings on their digital cameras to bail them



out in poor lighting situations. Occasionally they may flip open the flash on top of their camera and just "hope for the best."

Local commercial photographer John Adkins is going to help us out to take away the mystery of successful flash lighting. While many of us may use exposure compensation, John will also talk about flash compensation, as well as improving the quality of your light. He has a few other tips up his sleeve as well.




