Kenny will demonstrate his great passion for photography and enlighten us about Santa Fe.

It goes without saying that the Louisville Photographic Society has some of the best photographers in the region. In our continuing series to showcase this talent, we bring another LPS member, Kenny Pritchett, to present to us.



Kenny Pritchett retired from GE in May 2008, and he decided that a big piece of his retirement would be to explore his "creative side" (music, for instance, has been a long-time passion). He was introduced to photography as a teen-ager and loved it, but once "college and career" began, photography was all but forgotten.

He launched into the digital world in the summer of 2012, and simultaneously joined LPS. He says he has become completely addicted, and he is grateful for the kind support that he has received from everyone in LPS!

For the more technical folks in LPS, Kenny is using a Canon Rebel T3i, primarily Canon's hi-end 24-70 lens, he processes RAW with Adobe Camera Raw in Photoshop CS6, does B&W in

Nik's Silver Efex Pro, and frequently utilizes filtering from Nik's Color Efex Pro. With LPS's Steve Hamilton's encouragement, he is starting to experiment a bit with layers and masks.

Kenny will be presenting "Santa Fe: A Photographer's Paradise." Kenny says that Santa Fe is "under-known" in the photographic world, and he hopes to give it more visibility with an eclectic set of photographic examples. We can hardly wait to see what he has in store for us!

6. The book will be judged at the end of 2014 and awarded in February 2015.

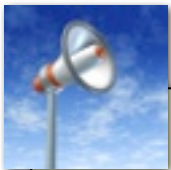

Members of the Novice group may submit a total of three prints. The prints may be in color or monochrome. 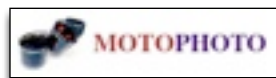
