# **Bill Luster to Present at September 10th Meeting**

One of photography's greats to speak.

LPS is proud to have Bill Luster present at our September meeting. Bill began his career as a newspaper photojournalist in 1965, when he joined the staff of The Glasgow Daily Times, his hometown newspaper. Four years later, Luster moved to Louisville where he started working for The Courier-Journal and The Louisville Times, eventually serving as director of photography, photo editor, and chief photographer. Spanning more than five decades, Bill has photographed nine US presidents. He has covered 49 Kentucky Derbies, four political conventions, four inaugurations, and was an official photographer for the inauguration of President George H.W. Bush. Bill has had two photo essays in The National Geographic as well as other photos that can be found in Time, Fortune, Sports Illustrated, Newsweek, Life, and the New York Times Magazine.

Bill Luster has been the recipient of many awards and honors for his photography. Preceding the Joseph Sprague award, which he received in July of 2010, Luster was awarded the title of Sports Photographer of the Year from the Kentucky News Photographers Association at Western Kentucky University, which had previously named him Visual Journalist of the Year in 2000. He was president of the National Press Photographers Association in 1993-1994. Also in 2000, the National Press Photographers Association (NPPA) awarded Luster the Joseph Costa Award for Innovative Leadership. Luster also received the Clarion Award for Environmental Reporting for work produced in Europe in 1984. He won a Pulitzer Prize in 1976 for Feature Photography along with eleven other members of The Courier-Journal and Louisville Times photography staff for coverage of court ordered busing. In 1989 the news and photography staff was awarded for Local Reporting Pulitzer Prize for their coverage of the nation's worst drunk-driving accident, which occurred in nearby Carrollton, KY. In 1982 he was a finalist for Newspaper Photographer of the Year. In the spring of 2012 he was inducted into the University of Kentucky Journalism Hall of Fame. He has judged the Pictures of the Year contest three times at the University of Missouri, most recently in 2013, and the Best of Photojournalism in 2014

In 2012-23 Bill was president of the Kentucky News Photographers Association and a member of the National Press Photographers Association Foundation. Recently, 21C Museum and Proof in downtown Louisville has honored him with a one year exhibit on his work. In addition, his work has been hanging in the gallery of the Arts Council of southern Indiana.

Bill Luster lives in Louisville, KY, with his wife of thirty-eight years, Linda, and their dog, Pearl.

# Book of the Year Rules Revised

In order to encourage more LPS members to compete, we have revised the 2014 Book of the Year Award Guidelines:

- 1. NEW! All images can be shot from any time period instead of just 2013 or later
- 2. NEW! All images do not have to be photographed by the LPS member. There should be enough original images for the LPS member to be considered and identified as author or editor. Other photos should be credited and added with permission.
- 3. The book must be printed after December 1, 2013 and before the December 2014 LPS meeting.
- 4. The book can be any size with no limit on dimensions or number of pages.
- 5. The book can be any subject matter.
- 6. Each member can submit one book per year for judging.
- 7. The book will be judged at the end of 2014 and awarded in February 2015.

The submitted book will be judged on overall content quality including photography, layout and editing.
