JANUARY'S SPEAKER CHAD JONES: DIGITAL PHOTO WORKFLOW

Wednesday, Jan. 8, 7:15 pm at ARGI Financial

Chad Jones, a locally based professional photographer specializing in wildlife and landscape images, will conduct a 30minute discussion on digital photography workflow from first capture to finished image.

Chad's 32+-year photographic journey has

also included fashion, commercial and editorial imaging, as well as weddings and classical portraiture. He has studied under PPA Master Photographers, National Geographic wildlife photographers and Canon Explorers of Light. Chad has photographed throughout the United States and in several international destinations; among his favorite locations are tropical climates, such as St. Lucia, West Indies and Hawaii, and coldweather treks in Maine, Wyoming and Montana.

Chad, who has professional proficiency with Adobe Photoshop and Lightroom, teaches group and private lessons focusing on photography fundamentals, Photoshop & Lightroom skills and workflow, and also conducts outdoor tours. The Paul Paletti Gallery, 713 E. Market Street, will host a photographer talk every first Friday of the month at 7:30 p.m. as part of the First Friday Hop. These professionals will show their work, share their experience and discuss their

LPS THROUGH HISTORY: A MONTHLY FEATURE

Early days: We're in the movies

Most of you know that LPS started in 1941. But what came to be LPS actually started as the Louisville Movie Club, organized by a group of enthusiastic color motion picture photographers at the Henry Watterson Hotel (between 4th and 5th on Walnut, now Muhammad Ali) on Feb. 5, 1941 (see postcard at right). Founders included first president Harold Rhodenbaugh, an acclaimed



The invitation postcard for the first Louisville Movie Club meeting in 1941.


Courier-Journal photographer, and businessman Frank Richterkessing, who later served as LPS president in 1943-46, 1949, 1954 and 1959.

It stayed movies only just until the next year, when officers gauged interest with a couple of "Camera Jamborees" in February and June of 1942. By the fall, movies and photography were sharing the bill at the monthly meetings, and in February 1944 the name was changed to the Louisville Photographic Society. However, monthly meetings through the early years included both photographic and movie presentations, usually by members, and a still photography topic for discussion, not competition. (*To be continued next month*)

1945: The meeting program, in the Leather Room of the Seelbach Hotel, included movies of the 1944 Manual-Male and Manual-New Brighton games, Kodachrome movies of Mexico and display of three photos on the January topic "Interiors." **1985**: Awards banquet will be Saturday, February 16 at the Kosair Temple, 812 S. 2nd St. Cost \$8 per person. Menu: Beef, chicken and pork with three vegetables, four salads, cherry pie and beverages.

1990: **Ron Lehocky** has a polar bear and lion picture in the 1990 Zoo Calendar; former member **Carolyn Vose** has the cover picture of elephants. ... **Menta DeLeuil**

won the 1989 William Clay Award, presented for service to the Kentucky Society of Natural History; in the society's year-end photo competition, **Gertrude Hudson** won 1st place, **Helen Cox** 2nd and DeLeuil 3rd. ... Murphy's Camera has opened a new full-service store in the Greentree Mall Plaza in Clarksville, IN.

1995: The LPS Showcase is Saturday/Sunday Jan. 21-22 at Bashford Manor Mall (site of current Christmas Shop).
Submit 15-20 slides to Bart Capuder or Gertrude Hudson no later than January 1. All photos must be on 16x20 mounts with double back Velcro attached and brought to the exhibit area January 20 for setup at 6 pm (volunteers needed).
2010: LPS banquet scheduled for Sunday, Feb. 7 at Episcopal Church Home. Social hour 5:30, buffet dinner at 6:30. Speaker will be Louisville Magazine photographer John Nation. \$25 per person.

2015: LPS will be moving to a new meeting location in February, ARGI Financial Group off Old Henry Road. ... Alice Thompson will become editor of the newsletter in February, replacing **Ken Tripp** ... LPS photographer **Robert Klein** had an exhibit of his work this past month at the Jewish Community Center in Louisville.

ABOUT THE LOUISVILLE PHOTOGRAPHIC SOCIETY

Membership in LPS is open to everyone. You must be a member of LPS to submit photos for competition. There are two levels of competition, Amateur and Advanced, and three categories at each level, Color Prints, Monochrome Prints, and Digital submissions. No more than 6 entries may be submitted, with no more than 2 entries in each group. Digital images must be submitted **no later than two weeks before the meeting** and must be no larger than 1 MB, with no more than 1024 pixels on the long side at a resolution of no higher than 120 DPI.

You MUST compete at the Advanced level if:

- You are a professional photographer (you earn more than 50% of your annual income from photography).
- · You have had a juried gallery showing.
- If you are an accomplished photographer and are not in the above groups, you are encouraged to enter at the Advanced level.
