



#### JULY SPEAKER: STEVE TAYLOR

Wednesday, July 15, 7:15 pm via Zoom

Steve Taylor, the assistant director of conservation education and collections at the Louisville Zoo, will be Wednesday night's Zoom speaker. Taylor is a film and digital photographer and an animal behaviorist who has worked at zoos since 1975 and at the Louisville Zoo for 30+ years. Taylor has taught hundreds of keepers the art of observation and animal training; he'll talk about the behaviors and natural history of native and zoo animals so that we might better learn how and when to photograph native and other wildlife.

Bring your own food and drink and a chair or picnic blanket, and please wear a mask.


A second gathering is tentatively planned for Saturday, Aug. 22 at Bernheim Forest but details for that are yet to be worked out.

#### LPS HISTORY: SUMMER FUN



Summer outings were an early tradition for LPS members. This photo is from a chartered bus trip to a photo shoot and picnic in the early 1950s.

Though this is the first time in more than 50 years that LPS is conducting regular meetings in July and August, summer activities always have been a part of the club. LPS has organized seminars, workshops, field trips, picnics, fish frys and outings galore over its nearly 80 years. Many have been local in spots such as the Zoo, Bernheim Forest and more recently Waterfront Park, but some outings have gone an hour west (to St. Meinrad or Marengo) or east (to Frankfort and Lexington). One even was hosted by a future Louisville mayor.

In the beginning, though, first the Louisville Movie Club (1941-43) and then LPS held monthly meetings through the summer for many years, usually at the Seelbach or Watterson Hotel downtown and then in the 1950s in Old Louisville. Those meetings went by the wayside in the 1960s, but informal club gettogethers dot all of LPS' history. The first one documented was an "Old Fashion Kentucky Burgoo" at Charles Farnsley's house on Aug. 9, 1942. Farnsley, who had been a state representative from 1936-40, was friends with several members but

never a member himself; he later became Louisville mayor from 1948-53.

In those days, there also were annual photo op/picnic/cookout/swimming trips to member Carl Finger's summer residence at Transylvania Beach on Upper River Road, basically directly under what is now the Lewis and Clark (East End) Bridge, and late-summer fish frys at South Park. One of them, in 1944, was postponed for two months because of Kentucky's worst polio epidemic (it ended with 718 reported cases and 37 counties classified as epidemic areas, including Jefferson).

## LPS HISTORY: SUMMER FUN (CONTINUED)

The 1980s were a decade of field trips, particularly in 1984 to Camp Merry Ledges in DePauw, IN, on the Blue River (it's now a rustic wedding venue); 1986 to the circus (and a chance to photograph) and the game farm west of Frankfort; and 1985 and 1988 to Bernheim Forest. Not so much in the 1990s though until 1999, when the club organized a guided tour/photo shoot (including raptor close-ups) at the Louisville Zoo.

The next summer started a four-year run at

member Sandy and husband Addison Nabb's farm in Marengo, Ind., including a potluck picnic, horses, horseshoe games and even one year rides in an ultralight airplane.

The current "summer seminars" – although they range from workshops to field trips to outings — started in 2006. The first two were taught by Eric Link on digital cameras and digital photography. Link, who helped start LPS' digital competition in June 2006 (and won

the first one) also taught both summer seminars

the next year, one on digital drawing tablets and

one on layers and masks used in photo editing

software. He also was a State Fair assistant

superintendent and photo contest judge but died of cancer five years ago. 2007 also was part of a run of summer photo shoots in Russ Johnson's Day Lily Garden.

Other summer seminar topics have included backyard wildlife habitats (Mike Matthews), high-speed photography (Greg Miller), studio photography (Clay Cook), and printing your own book (Kevin Laundroche, Ken Tripp and David Becker). Field trips have included Buffalo Trace Distillery, Hidden Hill Nursery, Old Friends Thoroughbred Retirement Farm, the First Friday Trolley Hop, Waterfront Park, the Zoo and St. Meinrad Academy and St. Benedict. For two years, Kay and George Sherrard hosted a day-long photo op/picnic/party. And then in 2015 started David and Cindy Becker's Misty Meadows potpourri/lunch in Floyd County, featuring photo walks and mini-seminars and demonstrations and portfolio reviews by some of Louisville's top photographers. Next up are a couple of socially distanced





#### ABOUT THE LOUISVILLE PHOTOGRAPHIC SOCIETY

Membership in LPS is open to everyone. You must be a paid member of LPS to submit photos for competition. There are two levels of competition, Amateur and Advanced, and three categories at each level, Color Prints, Monochrome Prints, and Digital submissions. Because of the pandemic, the Digital class has been suspended and Color Prints and Monochrome Prints switched to digital entry. No more than 2 entries allowed per category. Digital images must be submitted **no later than two weeks before the meeting** and must be no larger than 1 MB, with no more than 1024 pixels on the long side at a resolution of no higher than 120 DPI.

You MUST compete at the Advanced level if:

- · You are a professional photographer (you earn more than 50% of your annual income from photography).
- · You have had a juried gallery showing.
- · If you are an accomplished photographer and are not in the above groups, you are encouraged to enter at the Advanced level.
