NOVEMBER SPEAKER: TOM BARNETT

Wednesday, Nov. 10, 7:15 pm at All Peoples

LPS member Tom Barnett will present his favorite nature images in a show titled "Waterfalls, Landscapes, Birds and more...", that also will include tips and techniques for lighting, exposure, HDR and macro photography. He'll also include a preview of his current project: Recording small birds in flight using high-speed flash photography.

Tom is retired from a full-time commercial photography career that spanned 38 years at several studios and agencies in Louisville and for part of that time as the Chief Photographer at Brown-Forman Corporation. Catalogs for GE Appliance, Kimball Piano and Vermont American are also in his portfolio, as are many advertising, packaging, billboard

and annual-report cover images. He's also taught commercial photography at Jefferson Community and Technical College and served as a co-director of the annual PhotoScenic workshop. He's a 1979 graduate of the Rochester (NY) Institute of Technology.

DECEMBER: YOU BE THE JUDGE

As we did last year, members will judge all six categories through the Pollunit application, but hopefully my better familiarity with it will lead to a more streamlined procedure. More details (and I'll resend the directions) to come, but voting will likely be Nov. 30-Dec. 4. The winners' slideshow will run as usual at the December meeting on the 8th. Please note that the category, "Trees/Leaves," is meant to include trees or leaves from a tree. Here are the 2022 category explanations:

Bottles should include more than one bottle; A Pair of Things should include two matching or related items; Bokeh is the blurred quality or effect seen in the out-of-focus portion of a photograph taken with a narrow depth of field; Things in Motion should include some sort of motion blur, which is the purposeful streaking or blurring of an object in motion in a photo for visual effect; Uniforms must include at least one person. There are no clarifications/ restrictions on any other category, except for a reminder that the topic of the category should be the main focus of the photograph.

LOUISVILLE PHOTO BIENNIAL ENDING

STAN BOYD (1936-2021)

Stan Boyd, an LPS member from 2008-2018, died in late October in Louisville. His wife, Brenda, whom he married in 2004, had died in 2019. Stan was an active competitor, a lively presence at monthly meetings and a great friend to many members. Said John Holthaus, who met him at an adult education class in the mid-90s: "Stan was an engineer from Georgia Tech and grew up in Kentucky. He was an active boater, golfer, storyteller and big band lover ... A visit to Stan's house was part helping him fix a problem, and the other part was the stories and life lessons. There was always something to learn when talking to Stan about life and how to live, and I will not forget what he had to say. Thanks for the memories."

LPS HISTORY: HELENE BUSTER

Although the LPS was quite male-dominated for many years, there were female trailblazers. The first woman to hold an office other than secretary was Catherine Wiley, profiled in the February 2021 newsletter. But the first vice president (for stills) was Helene Buster, who served from 1951-53. Helene ran one of the top portrait studios in Louisville, Helene-Portraiture, inside the Frazier House at 1322 S. Fourth St., and joined LPS in 1948, the vear she won the Kentucky **Professional Photographers** Association contest with a

portrait of a 4-year-old blond girl. She eventually became KPPA president in 1951, the vear she won the group's contest again. Helene was on the Salon committee in 1949 and 1951-55 (no salon in 1950) and helped judge prints in 1952 and color slides in 1953 and 1955. She judged several other salons regionally, also painted in watercolor and was a sculptor, and hosted Louisville's first "Messy-Bessie" party in 1949. Presaging a popular pursuit nowadays, at those parties women were invited to paint, stencil, block print, etc., at a

host that served a buffet dinner. Her studio was open until at least the late 1960s.

Bill Rhodes took over the newsletter from longtime editor Terry Boice ... Program was a slideshow about looking for polar bears in Manitoba by Ethel Stoke ... The next special assignment was photos of McAlpine Locks and the surrounding area for the December meeting.

30 years ago: Category was Feeling Good. Winners were Bill Rhodes (slides), Ron Lehocky (color prints) and Jack Diehl (b/w prints); judge was Larry Spitzer ... The program was a slideshow from Russia by Ethel Stoke ... Dues were raised to \$25 for 1992.

25 years ago: Category was Scenics. Winners were Fred Engelmann (slides), Marshall Johnson (color prints) and Bob Wells (b/w prints); judge was Larry Spitzer ... Program was a slideshow, "Images of the West," by new member Fred Engelmann ... This was the first meeting at the new starting time of 7:30 ... Marshall Johnson won Best of Show, and Gertrude Hudson won Scenics and Close-Ups at Photoscenic Weekend, Oct. 11-13 at Natural Bridge State Park.

20 years ago: Category was Scenic. Winners were Deborah Brownstein (color prints) and Sandy Nabb (slides and b/w prints); judge was Weasie Gaines ... The program was "The Derby You Didn't See: Outtakes from Derby 127," from Associated Press photographer Tim Easley, the program postponed from the canceled September meeting.

15 years ago: Category was Scenic (no man-made objects). Winners were Deborah Brownstein (color prints), David Becker (b/w prints), Phil Warren (slides) and Fred Engelmann (digital); judge was Pamela Mattei ... The program featured tips on how to mat your own photographs and where to buy supplies ... It was announced that monthly meetings would be moved to the Episcopal Church Home in January. The club had been meeting at Thomas Jefferson Unitarian Church since February.

10 years ago: Category was Rain, Fog and Mist. Winners were Jim Ofcacek (digitals and monochrome prints), Larry DiChiara (color prints) and Lisa Koger (novice); judge was Shari Broeker ... Ken Tripp presented a program of the details of his recent winter eagle photography trips. ... Al Boice asked members to add more tape to their prints when mounting them as some came apart while being displayed in the Episcopal Church Home hallway. ... LPS short-sleeved polo shirts were available for sale at the meeting.





ABOUT THE LOUISVILLE PHOTOGRAPHIC SOCIETY

Membership in LPS is open to everyone. You must be a paid member of LPS to submit photos for competition. There are two divisions of competition, Amateur and Advanced, and three categories in each division, Color Prints, Monochrome Prints, and Digital submissions. Because of the pandemic, all classes (print and digital) must be entered digitally for monthly competitions through the end of 2021. No more than 2 entries allowed per category. Digital images must be submitted **no later than two weeks before the meeting** and must be no larger than 1 MB, with no more than 1024 pixels on the long side at a resolution of no higher than 120 DPI.

You MUST compete at the Advanced level if:

- · You are a professional photographer (you earn more than 50% of your annual income from photography).
- · You have had a juried gallery showing.
- · If you are an accomplished photographer and are not in the above groups, you are encouraged to enter at the Advanced level.
