# **Bylaws**

With a handful of updated proposals sent to members this past week, it's hoped that the membership can vote on the new bylaws at Wednesday night's meeting.

The revised proposals include a one-year test of making the digital category "creative"; establishing a brief discussion period after winners are announced for each competition; and setting a two-year window for the sliding scale of penalties for entering winners again. All of these will be open for discussion Wednesday before the vote. However, discussion and a vote on the new ethics document, the Guide to Responsible Photography, will be delayed until it is completed, hopefully within the month.

#### **Videos**

The Member's Choice video slideshow competition will return this month. The slideshow can be on any topic and can have music but should be restricted to 3 minutes.

Submit it on a thumb drive in an envelope with your name on it or with a tag attached with your name to ensure that it's returned to you.

DO NOT put your name anywhere in the slideshow itself.

For Mac users: Videos must be formatted to run on a PC. One option is to do it in Photoshop and export it as a video. Please test it on a PC before the meeting to make sure it will run. If it doesn't work on meeting night, it will not be entered.

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#### TIME TO PAY 2022 DUES

#### **CATEGORY EXPLANATIONS**

In conjunction with announcing 2022 categories earlier this year, it was agreed that those categories (which appear on the cover) would be explained in detail. Here they are:

Bottles should include more than one bottle; A Pair of Things should include two matching or related items; Bokeh is the blurred quality or effect seen in the out-of-focus portion of a photograph taken with a narrow depth of field; Uniforms must include at least one person. Things in Motion will be reviewed within the next month or two to determine how the category can be better defined. There are no clarifications/restrictions on any other category, except for a reminder that the topic of the category should be the main focus of the photograph.

#### **CLUB OFFICERS TO BE ELECTED IN FEBRUARY**

#### LPS HISTORY: THE WRITE STUFF

He was known as "Scoopy" because he started as a newspaper reporter, but original Louisville Movie Club member Maxwell Allen became one of the top handwriting experts in the region, lending his expertise to hundreds of trials and thousands of investigations over a 40-year career. Allen was LMC secretary in 1942-43 and the first editor of Radio-Grams, the club newsletter. He owned seven cameras shooting movies occasionally presented to the club, stills for pleasure and infrared-film photos used to detect irregularities on legal documents and salvage writing when they were burned.

The Louisville native — he was an orphan raised at the Masonic Home — trained dozens of other investigators through his own school, a side operation to his investigative agency, which he started in 1934 at age 26 after four years as a reporter and three more as an insurance inspector. He made a name for himself late

that year by exposing a Bible salesman who, to make money, took out an insurance policy on an associate, who allegedly drowned himself in the Ohio. But from handwriting samples, Allen proved that the drowning had been faked and the associate never existed, sending the salesman to jail for a year for fraud. Eventually, he became the go-to investigator throughout the region when handwriting was involved, providing expert testimony for the Commonwealth Attorney's Office and other agencies. In later life he made two unsuccessful primary runs for county commissioner and died in 1977 at age 68. His wife Ruth (1921-2015) served on the Board of Directors of the YMCA, Louisville General Hospital Auxiliary and the Arts Club of Louisville.



#### ABOUT THE LOUISVILLE PHOTOGRAPHIC SOCIETY

Membership in LPS is open to everyone. You must be a paid member of LPS to submit photos for competition. There are two divisions of competition, Amateur and Advanced, and three categories in each division, Color Prints, Monochrome Prints, and Digital submissions. No more than two entries are allowed per category, and you may enter in only one division each month. Digital images must be submitted **no later than two weeks before the meeting** and must be no larger than 1 MB, with no more than 1024 pixels on the long side at a resolution of no higher than 120 DPI.

You MUST compete at the Advanced level if:

- · You are a professional photographer (you earn more than 50% of your annual income from photography).
- · You have had a juried gallery showing.
- · If you are an accomplished photographer and are not in the above groups, you are encouraged to enter at the Advanced level.
