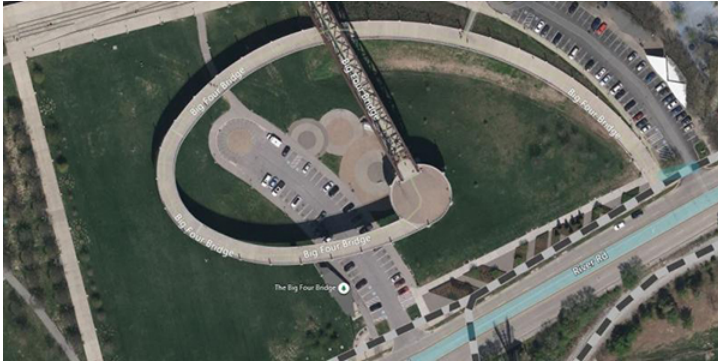
80TH BIRTHDAY PARTY TO BE JULY 9

This month in LPS history

80 years ago: LMC founder and then-president Harold Rhodenbaugh left the club to join the Army as a staff photographer; by September he was out of the service and on the staff of Look magazine in New York.

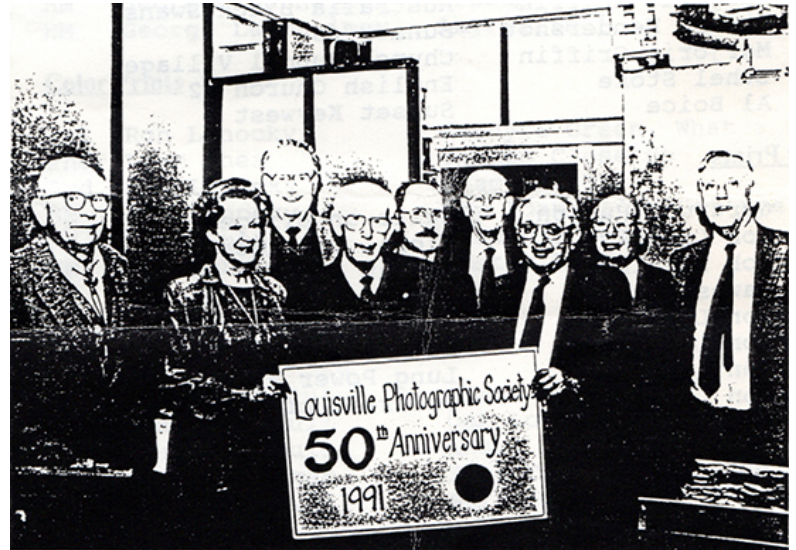
70 years ago: This year LPS met the third Wednesday of each month for photography and the fourth Wednesday for moviemakers.

40 years ago: Category was People at Work. Winners were Murphy Brock (slides), Benita Niemann (b/w prints) and Ethel Stoke (color prints) ... The two presentations were a movie by John Ohnimus, "Unfound Images," and a slideshow by Mary Ann Feuglein, "The People of New Guinea" ... The club held a "Close-Ups" workshop May 14 at the Audubon Park UMC, where meetings were then held.

35 years ago: Category was Street Scenes. Winners were Lynn Shea (slides and color prints) and Ethel Stoke (b/w prints); judge was Steve Hartman; special competition (Chimneys, Smokestacks, etc.) winners were Julian Sacksteder (slides) and Ethel Stoke (color prints) ... Courier-Journal photographer Keith Williams presented a program of his best shots during his (then) 13-year career ... A dozen LPS members photographed the March of Dimes Kickoff May 16 at Bowman Field. ... Competition categories were chosen for the next year: Nature Scenes (Sept. 1987), Children (Oct.), Flowers (Nov.), Fences (Dec.), Windows (Jan. 1988), Statues (Feb.), Ice (March), Wild Animals (April), Landscapes (May), Farm Animals (June).

30 years ago: Category was Rainy Days. Winners were Mary Wilkerson (slides), Bob Wells (color prints) and Sandy Nabb (b/w prints); judge was Allen Shadburne ... Bart Capuder presented a slideshow, "Day Into Night" ... The club held an

LPS HISTORY: HAPPY BIRTHDAY



LPS celebrated its 50th anniversary in 1991 with a party and a club gallery show at the Water Tower that summer.

When Harold Rhodenbaugh opened the first meeting of the Louisville Movie Club on Wednesday Feb. 5, 1941, he probably had no idea his brainchild would still be around eight decades later. And that's been cause for celebration every five or so years from 1966 on. On this and the facing page are a few photos from those, starting with the 50th in 1991 and going through the most recent, the 75th in 2016. Thanks to the pandemic, the 80th party was pushed back to an 81st, but this summer's celebration will be no less meaningful.

20 years ago: Category was Shadows. Winners were Fred Engelmann (slides), Margaret Fonda (color prints) and Sandy Nabb (b/w prints); judge was Karen Harold ... Engelmann presented a slideshow, "Spirit Lands," of his images from southern Utah national parks accompanied by Native American music.

15 years ago: Category was Roads, Paths & Highways. Winners were Marshall Johnson (slides), Deborah Brownstein (color prints), Kay Sherrard (b/w prints), Fred Engelmann (digital) and George Sherrard (novice); judge was Michael Sebastian ... Engelmann presented the program.

10 years ago: Category was Stop Action. Winners were Fred Engelmann (digitals), George Sherrard (color prints), Al Wollerton (monochrome prints) and Jack Cooney (novice); judge was Larry Spitzer ... Dan Rutledge of Unique Imaging Concepts presented a program highlighting the company's photographic printing on alternative media ... Bill Rhodes, LPS President in 1968-69 and a member for more than 40 years, died May 8. He was 85.

Five years ago: Category was Fences. Winners were Greg Miller (digitals), Kevin Turner (color prints), Kay Sherrard (monochrome prints) and Carolyn Hawkins; judges were David Becker and Katie Cowherd ... John Snell discussed his book, "Red River Gorge, My Second Home."

CATEGORY EXPLANATIONS

Category explanations and restrictions for monthly competitions:

Bokeh is the blurred quality or effect seen in the out-of-focus portion of a photograph taken with a narrow depth of field;

Uniforms must include at least one person.

Things in Motion will be reviewed to determine how the category can be better defined. An overall reminder is that the topic of the category should be the main focus of the photograph.

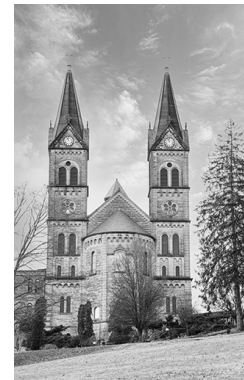

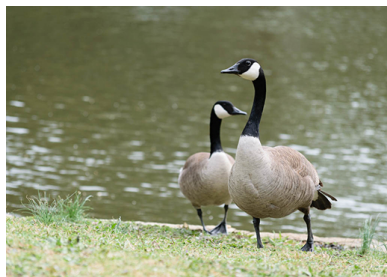

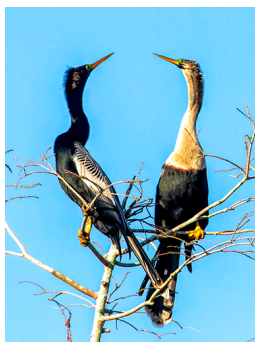

ABOUT THE LOUISVILLE PHOTOGRAPHIC SOCIETY

Membership in LPS is open to everyone. You must be a paid member of LPS to submit photos for competition. There are two divisions of competition, Amateur and Advanced, and three categories in each division, Color Prints, Monochrome Prints, and Digital submissions. No more than two entries are allowed per category, and you may enter in only one division each month. Digital images must be submitted **no later than two weeks before the meeting** and must be no larger than 1 MB, with no more than 1024 pixels on the long side at a resolution of no higher than 120 DPI.

You **MUST** compete at the Advanced level if:

- You are a professional photographer (you earn more than 50% of your annual income from photography).
- You have had a juried gallery showing.
- If you are an accomplished photographer and are not in the above groups, you are encouraged to enter at the Advanced level.
