MAY PROGRAM: HANDS OF TIME

Wednesday, May 14, 7 pm at St. Luke's Church

Former LPS member Fred DiGiovanni will discuss his "Hands of Time Cento Anni" gallery show that was exhibited this past fall at Murray State University (DiGiovanni's alma mater, 1971). "Cento anni" means 100 years and is often said as a toast to mean "100 years of health."

In addition to his talk, Fred will bring photographs from the exhibition for viewing. The New York-born DiGiovanni taught



middle school art in Louisville for more than 25 years, retiring in 1999 to become a photographer fulltime.

He also studied photography while in grad school at the University of Louisville and later at the Maine Photographic Workshop, Rocky

STATE FAIR INFORMATION

Entries have opened for the 2025 Kentucky State Fair. Fee is \$17 per exhibitor (up from \$15) plus \$1 per individual photograph entered. The application deadline to enter will be July 10, but the upload deadline will be July 17. All entries, print and digital, must be submitted digitally; print entries will be screened and reduced to the maximum that can be hung in the photography exhibit, while all digital entries will qualify for final judging. Divisions again are Accomplished, Aspiring and Student. There are four print categories in both monochrome and color — people, wildlife, scenic and unclassified — and a fifth, digitalonly category, Kentucky Fairs. More details can be found in the State Fair premium book available online at kystatefair.org/compete.

Signups to start this week

Signups to volunteer for hooking/check-in/hanging/assisting during Fair/check-out will



begin at Wednesday night's meeting. Anyone working a full 3-hour shift will receive a one-day Fair ticket good for parking and admission. Also LPS has been invited to showcase its club at the Fair on Saturday, Aug. 16. More details to come.

Assistant superintendent opening

The Fair still seeks at least one assistant superintendent for photography. The position pays \$600 with free admission; applicants must be able to staff check-in, check-out and a 4-5-hour shift on at least three Fair days. DIG- A- 005- 020119- 0525- Title An example:

DIG-A-005-020119-0525-Pretty Picture

Dig- Indicates a digital entry **A-** Use "A" for advanced, "M" for Amateur

Color prints

005- First (or only) entry. 2nd entry is 006.

020119- Using A-1 and Z-26, initials for Betty Ann Smith.

0525- Denoting May 2025 for the monthly competition. June 2025 will be 0625, etc.

Pretty Picture- Your title; needs to match actual file name of submission.

LPS has been invited to exhibit members' photographs Aug. 14-Oct. 14. Photos will be displayed in the secure entrance display cases behind glass.



Photos may be any genre (landscape, portraits, animals, architecture, etc.) EXCEPT for nudes. Photos may be color or monochrome. The image must be at least 80 square inches; the mat can be any color. The photo must be matted or sized to exactly 16" x 20" so it will fit in the frame LPS will provide. The frames will be available at the May and June meetings.



This month in LPS history

80 years ago: The regular monthly meeting was held May 17 in the mezzanine parlor of the Watterson Hotel. It included a quarterly movie assignment, "Spring Scenes," filmed by members; a 35mm Kodachrome slide show by members (maximum 10 per member); and the monthly print assignment, "Buildings." **45 years ago:** Category was Rain. Winners were Chester FitzZaland (slides), Bob Dentinger (b/w prints) and Ethel Stoke (color prints) ... Program was Bill Rhodes' movie of the 1979 Ringling Bros. circus show in Lexington's Rupp Arena ... The club took a field trip to Madison, IN on May 17, with lunch in the Hanover College faculty dining

40 years ago: Category was Rural Scenes. Winners were Danny Dempster (slides), Jack Baxter (b/w prints) and Ethel Stoke (color prints); judge was Warren Klosterman ... Program was "Kentucky's Feathered Rainbow," a 16mm movie from the Kentucky Fish and Wildlife Dept. ... The club took a field trip the evening of May 2 to Gerald Weber's house for outdoor wildlife photos. 35 years ago: Category was Scenes of Louisville. Winners were Helen Cox (slides), Ron Lehocky (color prints) and Jack Diehl (b/w prints); judges were Carmen Wethers and Robert Douglas ... Program was "Many Technical Changes, But Photography Remains the Same," a discussion of new technology in photography led by John Carroll of Schuhmann's Click Clinic. ... Member Ed Howard was featured in a local TV special on the history of the Howard Boat Works in Jeffersonville. ... Danny Dempster was one of the official photographers for the Kentucky Derby Festival. ... 28 members went on the Shakertown trip on May 12 and braved poor weather for good picture taking; a category for images from the trip was added to the June contest.

30 years ago: Category was Humorous Animal Shots. Winners were Gertrude Hudson (slides), Debbie Cole (color prints) and Judy Rosati (b/w prints); judge was Zana Naake ... Program was a slide presentation from Pulitzer Prize-winning Courier-Journal photographer Bill Strode ... Doris McDowell (who wintered in Florida) won first place in the Southwest (FL) Regional 4 Club competition with a slide titled "Musical Instruments."



A plan for four LPS cameramen club president Frank Richterkessing, plus Edward Raible, J. Carl Finger and Vernon Fields — to film the 1946 Kentucky Derby and ship it to New York for a Sunday CBS telecast is thwarted when newsreel and photo-finish photographers threaten to strike if Churchill Downs approves the arrangement. Eventually, WAVE was the first to televise the Derby in 1949, and CBS did the first live national telecast in 1952 (see April 2020 newsletter for more details).

25 years ago: Category was Downtown. Winners were Deborah Brownstein (color prints), Ted Lissauer (b/w prints) and Al Boice (slides); judge was Steve Villwock ... Program was presented by Fred Engleman and Fred DiGiovanni. who talked about what they shoot after the scheduled speaker canceled 30 minutes before the meeting ... Gertrude Hudson (best of show, first place color), Becky Wright (2nd place landscape, 3rd place special effects) and Deborah Brownstein (first place B&W) won awards in the Kentucky Daffodil Society photo contest. 20 years ago: Category was Silhouettes. Winners were Greta Garbo (color prints), T.Y. Huang (b/w prints) and Al Wollerton (slides); judge was Terry Miller ... Doris McDowell presented a slide show of the National Cathedral in Washington, DC. ... The LPS Board of Directors decided to allow digital manipulations in competition as long as they complied with LPS bylaws.

15 years ago: Category was Silhouettes. Winners were Steve Hamilton (digitals and color prints), Josef Szilagyi (monochrome prints) and Cathy Jacob (novice); judge was Lori Reeder, who made and explained her selections in front of the membership for the monthly program ... David Becker had two images ("Cannon Beach Starfish" and "Sunset") selected among the 22 winning the Nature's Best Photography magazine "Ocean View" contest. Photos were published in the Spring/ Summer issue.

10 years ago: Category was Graffiti or Murals. Winners were Alice Thompson (digitals), Kay Sherrard (color prints), Robert Klein (monochrome prints) and Van Jaggers (novice); judge was Ted Wirth ... Speaker was Dan Rutledge of Unique Imaging Concepts, sharing the various printing methods and substrates his company offers.

Five years ago: The scheduled meeting and monthly contest were canceled because of the COVID pandemic ... The newsletter featured 46 images from 13 members in the "Your Best Shot" section ... The club started its members-only Facebook page ... In June, meetings resumed via Zoom and the monthly contest was restarted as digital only.

ABOUT THE LOUISVILLE PHOTOGRAPHIC SOCIETY

Membership in LPS is open to everyone. You must be a paid member of LPS to submit photos for competition. There are two divisions of competition, Amateur and Advanced, and three categories in each division, Color Prints, Monochrome Prints, and Digital submissions. No more than two entries are allowed per category, and you may enter in only one division each month. Digital images must be submitted **no later than two weeks before the meeting** and must be no larger than 2 MB, with no more than 2000 pixels on the long side at a resolution of no higher than 200 DPI.

You MUST compete at the Advanced level if:

- · You are a professional photographer (you earn more than 50% of your annual income from photography).
- · You have had a juried gallery showing.
- · If you are an accomplished photographer and are not in the above groups, you are encouraged to enter at the Advanced level.
